SIDDALLS CUP COMPETITION RULES - 2010

Major modifications from 2009 are shown in blue

1. The Laws of Cricket 2000 Code 2nd Edition (2003) shall apply except where specified in the playing conditions.
2. All players must have FFBS competition licences and insurance and players born in the years **1991-1995** must appear on the list of recognised 'surclassements'. The captains shall confirm this to the umpires by showing them a list of the club's licensed and 'surclassés' players with those playing clearly marked. For players under 18 years old on the day of the match, the ECB/ECC regulations concerning young players shall apply in full. The 12th man or another player may act as scorer if there is not one available with the team – by agreement between the captains and umpires there may be just one scorer.
3. **The minimum team size is 7 players.** Each team shall receive a maximum of 35 overs. No bowler may bowl more than 7 overs.
4. The team scoring the higher number of runs in the allocated number of overs shall be the winner.
 - a. In the event of a tie the side losing the fewer number of wickets shall be the winner,
 - b. If both sides have lost the same number of wickets then the issue shall be decided by bowling at an unprotected set of stumps as follows (penalty shoot out): -
 - (i.) 5 bowlers from each side shall bowl one ball alternately; the side with the greater number of hits shall be the winner,
 - (ii.) if the match is still tied, a sixth bowler from each side shall bowl - and so on until there is a winner.
5. The home team shall supply 2 new balls – CA Sports or equivalent – from the ACCSO-supplied balls. For the Semi-finals and Final, ACCSO shall supply the balls.
6. Umpires shall be appointed by ACCSO
7. Playing Conditions
 - a. Matches shall commence at either 1p.m. or 2p.m. but other times may be agreed between the teams if they so wish. It is the responsibility of the home captain to keep the umpires informed of the agreed starting time.

- b. Drinks to be taken after 17 overs or as otherwise agreed between the captains and the umpires according to the weather conditions.
 - c. Any short pitched delivery which passes or would have passed above shoulder height of the batsman standing upright at the crease shall be called a 'No Ball'.
 - d. The bowling of high full pitched balls is dangerous and Law 42.6.b shall apply in full.
 - e. The National League 'Wide' rules shall apply: -
 - (i) all off-side deliveries, not struck by or striking the batsman, that pass on or outside a line 89 cms/35 inches from middle stump shall be called 'wide', Home teams must ensure that these marks are in place and clearly visible.
 - (ii) all balls, not struck by or striking the batsman, passing behind the profile of the batsman in his normal guard position shall be called 'wide',
 - (iii) [an advisory notice 'Wide Balls', dated 02/06/2010, has been sent to ACCSO umpires.](#)
 - f. Weather-interrupted matches: -
 - (i.) if the home side decides that its ground is unfit for play because of bad weather, it must inform the opposition and the umpires not less than 3 hours before the scheduled start time,
 - (ii.) from the scheduled start time the two umpires shall be the sole judges of whether the ground is fit for play,
 - (iii.) if the match is interrupted during the first innings then for every full or part of 8 minutes lost the match shall be reduced by 2 overs and the maximum number in the first innings by one. For example, if 75 minutes are lost the match is reduced, by $10 \times 2 = 20$ overs, to 25 overs per side. If the side batting first has already received more than the reduced numbers of overs (25, in this example) it shall receive no more and the target for the team batting second shall be calculated on the basis of the runs scored by the team batting first divided by the number of overs they actually faced,
 - (iv.) if the match is interrupted during the second innings then for each full or part of 4 minutes lost the innings will be reduced by 1 over. The winning target shall be calculated on the basis of the runs scored by the team batting first divided by 35 overs or the actual overs available if the innings was reduced,
 - (v.) in a reduced-overs match no bowler shall bowl more than 20% of the available overs, rounded up, unless he has already done so before the interruption. For example, in a match reduced to 28 overs per side, no bowler may bowl more than 6 overs.
 - (vi.) to constitute a match the team batting second must receive a minimum of 20 overs, unless it is dismissed in less than 20 overs or reaches the opposition score in less than 20 overs. In the event of less than 20 overs being available the match shall be abandoned and re-scheduled.
8. The winning team shall send the match result, together with any performances of note, by e-mail to accso.secretary@orange.fr as soon as possible after the match and not later than 24hrs after the match has finished.
